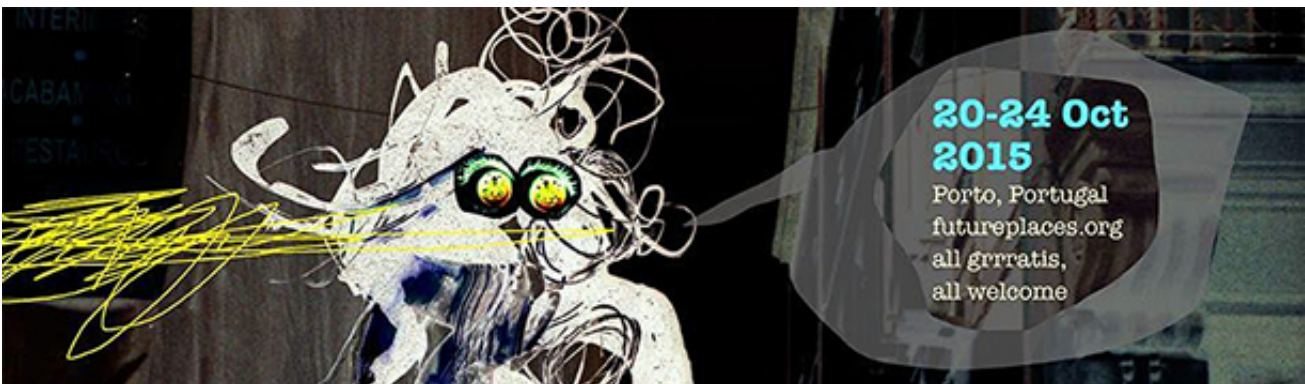
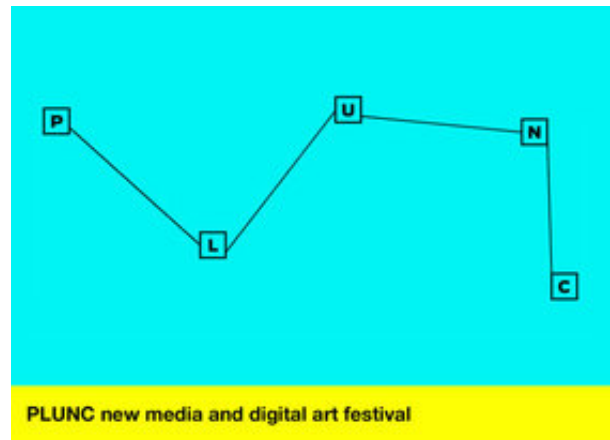

This year's agenda included a scientific recital, an exhibition marking the inauguration of the participatory project "Porto Pelo Porto", a wealth of Citizen Labs, the digital media doctoral symposium, and keynote addresses by Paul Stacey of EdTechFrontier and Chris Csikszentmihalyi of the Madeira Interactive Technologies Institute (M-ITI). The Doctoral symposium was a success with a keynote by Chris Csikszentmihalyi along with 11 presentations by current students from Lisbon, Porto and Madeira as well as two alumni of the doctoral program.
